What you will do

Working within the Programme Team, and under the direction of the Programme Manager, the Business Change Analyst will be responsible for analysing business change activity and assessing the potential impact of the Cyber Security Programme to improve the protection and resilience of our operational technology systems, including SCADA and Industrial Control Systems, against a range of evolving threats.

The purpose of the role is to ensure that the requirements for business change are understood and adequately documented before projects get underway. To achieve this the IT business change analyst will be expected to help articulate the way in which business change could affect users on a day-to-day basis. Change analysts must be great verbal and written communicators, tactful diplomats, problem solvers, thinkers and analysers - with the ability to engage with stakeholders to understand and respond to their needs in rapidly changing business environments.

What you'll be responsible for

1. Understanding and documenting the requirements for change ensuring that the projects making up the OT Cyber Security Programme have properly understood definitions of business change and identified benefits that are to be delivered in the teams and departments affected.
2. Understand the impact level of change and ensure that the project plans fully record what is needed – and that this is understood by the business units who will be responsible for delivering the change.
3. Working with key stakeholders and teams to ensure that change is clearly understood and successfully implemented and embedded
4. Identifying, proposing and developing new ideas for change ensuring the required documentation is in place
5. Working with key stakeholders to review existing 'as-is' processes, defining and documenting 'to-be' processes by identifying gaps and areas of improvement and efficiency
6. Prioritising the requirements for change across the projects within the OT Cyber Security Programme
7. Managing relationships with other business areas to ensure that the OT Programme team is seen as the place to come to progress any ideas for operational technology change
8. Provide business support by understanding the integration between the organisation, business process and the underlying technology components
9. Understanding and experience of the requirements capture to implementation life-cycle and is expected to liaise internally across multiple departments and teams and with project representatives from third-party contract organisations.
10. Developing an understanding of internal tools and processes and impact the way teams in our company work together to deliver the right outcomes
11. Working closely with the relevant business teams to ensure that the transition from project to service is seamless
12. Support at locations throughout Wales (if required)

- Documenting a change approach, plan and strategy for the OT Cyber Security Programme
- Development of appropriate change management plans for all OT Cyber Security Programme projects with change management requirements
- Identifying what changes in processes, procedures and practices are needed to deliver sustainable and beneficial change
- Running a requirements gathering/definition workshop
- Performing quality assurance of business deliverables
- Constructing process models
- Planning and running workshops involving business stakeholders and delivery teams
- Effectively present options and recommendations to senior stakeholders
- Identifying and supporting business implementation tasks
- Identifying and documenting project risks, issues, assumptions and dependencies
- Co-ordinating a Change Network (engage with users)
- Development of communications strategies and plans
- Stakeholder engagement and management
