INTRODUCTION

From cleaning surfaces to removing makeup and changing nappies, there's a wet wipe for every occasion. But while they are convenient, they pose a huge threat to the environment if they're not disposed of correctly.

And it's not just wet wipes.

Every year Welsh Water clear thousands of blockages from our sewers caused by items that shouldn't be flushed, including sanitary items, cotton pads, and nappies. These items are all made from plastic, which makes them extremely durable and means they don't break down in water.

Instead, they form fatbergs in our sewers – which are huge masses of waste, wet wipes, cooking fats, and oils, that eventually block pipes.



DID YOU KNOW?

WET WIPES ARE USUALLY THE MAIN COMPONENT OF FATBERGS

We work hard to raise awareness of the issue, so that our customers know about the problems it can cause. However people continue to flush and rinse things they shouldn't, and it is currently the cause of around 60% of the blockages experienced in Welsh Water's pipes.

That's why, we need your help.

It's important that our customers understand the issues caused by wrongly flushed items and the devastation it can have on homes, neighbouring properties, local communities and the environment.


Please help us remind people about the importance of correctly disposing these items and how together we make a big difference.

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN WIPES ARE FLUSHED

The truth is, just one single wipe is enough to block your sewer pipe. If it's not your pipe, it could be the pipes near your home, or your neighbours. When sewage can't flow down the sewer pipes because of a blockage, it could result in flooding in your street, garden or even back into yours or your neighbours homes.


Imagine if a friend or relative experienced sewage flooding into their home because of your flushing habits. This is a hugely distressing situation, and one that can be avoided.

The truth is every flush matters. It's important you only flush or drain away natural human waste (pee and poo) and toilet paper to help stop blockages, sewer flooding and pollution.

HOW TO AVOID BLOCKAGES IN THE KITCHEN

Fat, oil, and grease may not appear to be harmful, but as they cool, they harden and stick. If poured down the drain or sink, you're risking a blockage in part or all the pipework which can cause disaster in yours or your neighbour drains. The good news is, it's easy to protect your home or business from floods and misery that can be caused by blocked pipes.



HOW TO AVOID BLOCKAGES IN THE WORKPLACE

Disposing of FOG via the sink, drain (including down manholes) or toilet is seen as a criminal offence, under Section 111(1) (a) of the Water Industry Act 1991 — the Act states that it is an offence "to discharge into the public sewers any matter which may interfere with the free flow of wastewater".

The truth is, ignoring the law can lead to you cause sewer blockages, risking having to cover the costs of putting it right, and any damage caused to neighbouring properties or the environment.





DON'T RISK A FLOOD. ACT NOW.

There are many reasons why blockages occur, but they're most often caused by items such as wet wipes and sanitary products that are flushed down the toilet, or by leftover cooking fats and oils poured down the kitchen sink.

THROW ALL WIPES, (EVEN THOSE LABELLED FLUSHABLE CAN CAUSE BLOCKAGES), SANITARY ITEMS, COTTON BUDS AND NAPPIES AWAY IN THE BIN.






